

SUMMARY

Subject of the thesis: The Nagorno-Karabakh conflict: contemporary dynamics and prospects for its development.

Relevance of the research issue is determined by the importance to search mechanisms for the Nagorny Karabakh conflict settlement. The Nagorny Karabakh conflict has deep historical roots. For many years, its dynamics has taken different forms: the latent or the apparent (armed) confrontation between conflicting parties. It is obvious that the two parties cannot resolve this conflict without the international community intervention, but the role of international organizations in resolving this confrontation is increasing.

The object of the study is the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict.

The subject of research: The problems and prospects of the development of the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict.

The purpose of the work is identification of the key problems of the escalation of the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict and the assessment of its development prospects.

Research objectives:

- explore approaches to the definition of the concept and the nature of international conflicts;
- examine the modern methods of international conflicts settlement;
- determine the causes and the nature of the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict;
- analyze the causes of the contemporary escalation of the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict and its development prospects.

The scientific novelty of the research: The key problems of the settlement of the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict are systematized; the prospects of its further development are evaluated in the context of the recent escalation.

The structure of the work consists of an introduction, two chapters, 4 paragraphs, conclusion, a 60 reference bibliography (13 of them are in a foreign languages). The total volume is 66 pages.

Summary: The Nagorno-Karabakh conflict is not the ethno-political one in a "pure form". In the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict ethnic, political, social, economic and many other lines of rivalry are intertwined. Both conflicting parties adduce a significant number of historical, political and legal reasons to justify their positions and policies. However, Azerbaijan, Armenia and Nagorny Karabakh, not showing any willingness to compromise, lay the blame on the opposing party for the escalation of the conflict.
